We aim to create experiences that foster creative, constructive, and sustainable solutions, from local communities to global advocacy networks.

Overview of 2020

- Co-organized over 30 online events on oceans, climate, disarmament, and other topics related to the UN Sustainable Development Goals.

Highlights

Ocean Conservation

Peace Boat US works to advance UN Sustainable Development Goal 14: Life Below Water through advocacy, education, and collaboration. Youth activists from around the world are given opportunities for professional development, networking, and engagement with global advocacy efforts through our work, such as our educational outreach program for youth from Small Island Developing States. Such projects, including the development of the EcoShip and significant involvement in Friends of UN World Oceans Day activities help to spread awareness of the innovative solutions to restore and protect our oceans and marine life.

Key Activities in 2020 for SDG 14: Ocean Conservation included:

June 8– UN World Oceans Day and Week

Since being first held in 2008, UN World Oceans Day is a key global event in ocean advocacy. The 2020 theme was “Innovation for our Ocean” – fitting, as 2020 was the first time to hold the event entirely online. Peace Boat US was proud to co-organize many events with the Friends of UN World Oceans Day community, including:

Climate Action

Peace Boat US works to raise awareness, support, and increase engagement with SDG 13: Climate Action, especially among young people around the world through a wide scope of events, programs, and partnerships. The global nature of climate ties all people and our ecosystem together more than any other issue. As such, we work to engage with communities and organizations around the world to raise awareness about climate solutions.

Key activities for SDG 13: Climate Action included:

July 9– UN High-Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development

Peace Boat US participated in the United Nations High-Level Political Forum (HLPF) on Sustainable Development. The HLPF annual meeting is the core United Nations platform for follow-up and review of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its 17 Sustainable Development Goals.

Peace Boat US organized the side event “Youth Engagement in the SDGs during the Pandemic: Voices from the Frontline”. The event aimed to promote youth engagement with Climate Action by hearing from participants in our Ocean and Climate Youth Ambassadors Program and Youth for the SDGs program, as well as presentations by H.E. Ms. Penelope Beckles, Permanent Representative of Trinidad & Tobago to the United Nations, Mr Chet Monday, Director of Youth Engagement, March for Science, and Mr Hatim El Otmani, Founder and President of Atlas For Development and African Youth Climate Hub Ambassador.



September 30 – Climate Cinema

Climate Cinema was a series of nearly 40 short films presented by Peace Boat US and partners for Climate Action at the end of Climate Week NYC. Produced by Peace Boat US and partners for Climate Action and utilizing the Social Impact Media Awards (SIMA) virtual theater, the films raised awareness about global issues while showcasing inspiring stories for climate action and sustainable development.

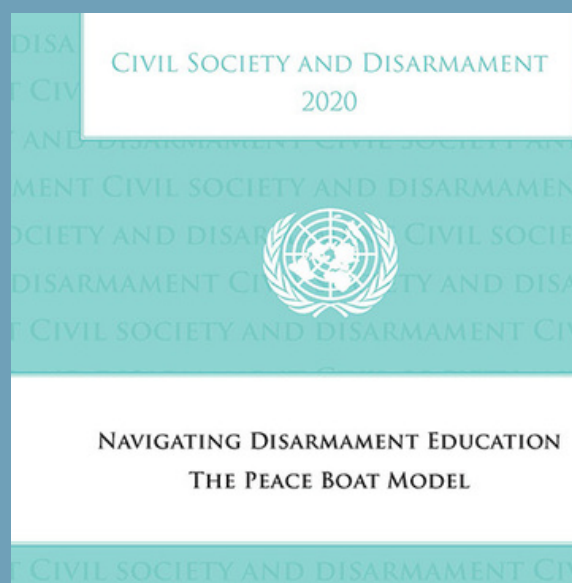
Disarmament

Peace Boat US advocates and educates for disarmament and a nuclear-free world, in collaboration with the international NGO Peace Boat, which is a steering group member of the International Campaign to Abolish Nuclear Weapons (ICAN), 2017 Nobel Peace Prize laureate. These efforts contribute to SDG 16: Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions. 2020 saw the launch of various new programs, including an online initiative to celebrate, honor and learn from Hibakusha, atomic bomb survivors from Hiroshima and Nagasaki, about the humanitarian impacts of nuclear weapons.

Key disarmament activities included:

November 3 – Navigating Disarmament Education: The Peace Boat Model

Peace Boat US facilitated a publication by the United Nations Office of Disarmament Affairs (UNODA) introducing Peace Boat's methodology for disarmament education. Part of the series "Civil Society and Disarmament," the publication "Navigating Disarmament Education: The Peace Boat Model" directly stems from lessons learned through the implementation of various disarmament education programmes over the past decades. It also discusses how disarmament education should be implemented in relation to the SDGs and how digital technologies can be leveraged to provide a fruitful experience for participants. An event to launch the publication was held on November 3, 2020, including opening remarks by Ms Izumi Nakamitsu, the United Nations High Representative for Disarmament Affairs and a discussion with Peace Boat colleagues Akira Kawasaki, Sumiko Hatakeyama, Meri Joyce and partners.



December 14 – Every Second Counts for the Survivors

Following the 75th anniversary of the atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki in August 2020, Peace Boat US joined in the launch of the new project, “Every Second Counts for the Survivors! – Peace Boat Hibakusha Project Online.” The series of online Hibakusha testimony sessions are taking place in more than 190 countries and regions to gain greater support for the Hibakusha’s plea and the UN Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons (TPNW). Peace Boat US coordinated several online testimony events, including on December 14 together with the United Nations Office for Disarmament Affairs and #Youth4Disarmament network, featuring a testimony session by Hibakusha Michiko Hattori who survived the atomic bombing in Hiroshima.



Youth Engagement

Across its focus areas including the Ocean, Climate, and Disarmament, Peace Boat US prioritizes the involvement and education of youth from around the world who are passionate about Peace Boat's missions of sustainable development and international cooperation. Through the "Youth for the SDGs" scholarship and our internship program, young people have the opportunity to engage with the work of Peace Boat US through research and collaboration, furthering our mission while developing their own passions, networks, and skills towards achieving the SDGs in their home communities.

Key youth-focused activities in 2020 included:

Internship Program

Over the course of 2020, more than 18 interns in four cohorts supported advocacy campaigns, administration, media, and other areas of Peace Boat US' work while connecting with other NGOs and civil-society organizations and the United Nations. Representing over 10 nationalities, interns contributed on average 15 hours per week of remote work, with each cohort working for around 3-4 months.

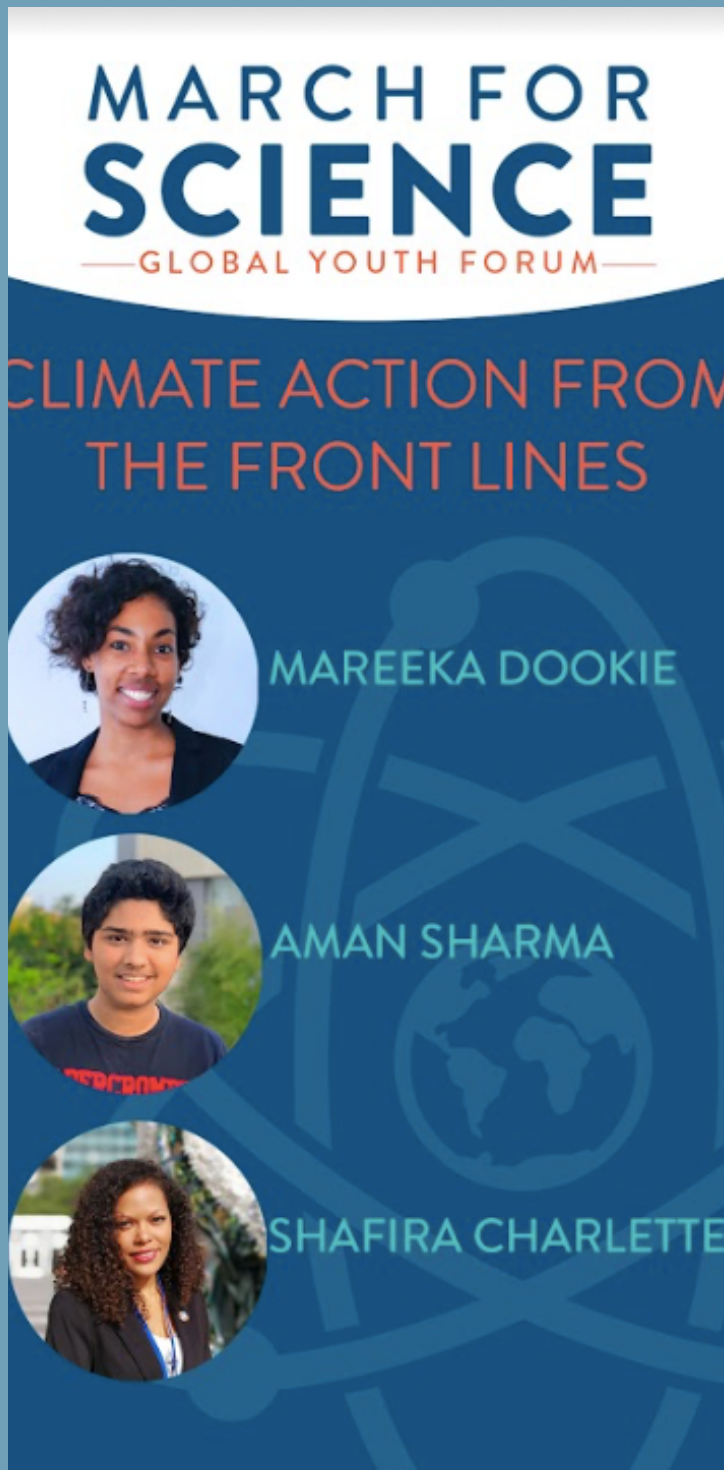
April 26 – Global Youth Forum: Champions for the SDGs!

In partnership with March for Science, Peace Boat US invited participants in the “Youth for the SDGs” and “Ocean and Climate Youth Ambassador” programs previously held onboard the Peace Boat, to share their experiences, insights, and local solutions to climate change as part of our 2020 Ocean Youth Leaders spotlight series.

The “Ocean and Climate Youth Ambassador” program demonstrated the opportunity for youth leaders from Small Island Developing States (SIDS), who are on the front line of climate change and marine degradation, to travel aboard Peace Boat’s voyage and engage in capacity building and to share their message with citizens and government representatives. This program was launched at the Ocean Conference at the United Nations in 2017 and has been held annually since. The “Youth for the SDGs” scholarship program, similarly, invites young people actively working on sustainability for the oceans and climate action in their local communities to share their solutions and best practices in achieving the UN Sustainable Development Goals at the local level from a youth perspective.

Additional 2020 Activities

January

Fundraiser for Wildfires in Australia

Collaboration with the Peace Boat Disaster Relief Volunteer Center (PBV) to raise funds for the devastating wildfires across Australia in late 2019, donated to the Fire Relief Fund for First Nations Communities.

Advocating for Nuclear Disarmament at New York City Council

Peace Boat US joined with over 60 people including Peace Boat US Director Emilie McGlone and survivors of the atomic bombings of Japan to persuade the City Council to support legislation toward establishing a nuclear-free zone in NYC.

February

UN Ocean Conference Preparatory Meeting

Peace Boat US contributed to the UN Ocean Conference preparatory meetings at the United Nations Headquarters, helping to promote SDG 14 for Life Below Water and science-based solutions including green technology, innovative uses of marine resources, partnerships, and increasing awareness regarding these solutions.



March

Peace Boat US Joins International Alliance to Combat Ocean Acidification

Partnership with the International Alliance to Combat Ocean Acidification (OA Alliance) helps strengthen civil-society and governmental cooperation around the world for protecting coastal communities and livelihoods.

Global Youth Forum: Champions for the SDGs! “From the Front Lines”

In partnership with March for Science, former participants in the “Youth for the SDGs” and “Ocean and Climate Youth Ambassador” programs shared experiences, insights, and local solutions to climate change.

International Responsibility for Nuclear Disarmament – NGO Statement to Nuclear Non Proliferation Treaty (NPT) Parties

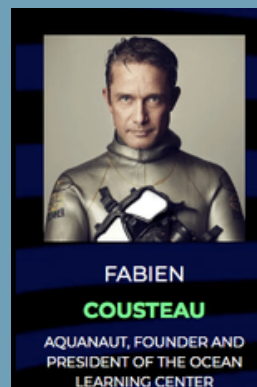
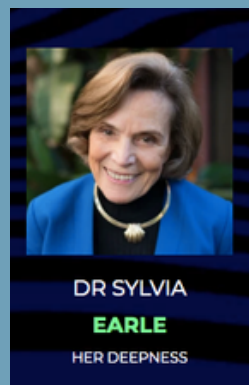
Collaborated with more than 80 civil society organizations around the world on a joint statement encouraging NPT states to progress on their obligations toward nuclear disarmament.

June

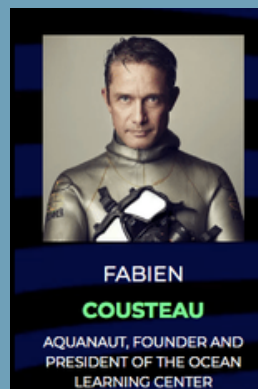
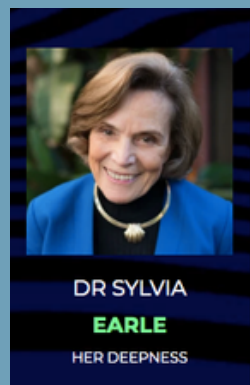

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UN World Oceans Day

Peace Boat was involved in the organization of various online events to support the theme of the 2020 UN World Oceans Day as a major partner, including interviews, film screenings, and discussions with various organizations working towards a sustainable ocean. More than 350,000 people tuned in to the events, taking place on a virtual platform for the first time in history, reaching partners around the world.



UN World Oceans Week: EarthXOcean

EarthX and the National Geographic Society convened virtually to celebrate UN World Oceans Week from June 9-11 at EarthX.org. Participants from Peace Boat US' "Youth for the SDGs" program and Peace Boat's "Ocean and Climate Youth Ambassadors" program shared their experiences online with viewers from around the globe.

Webinar with SeaAhead and Blue Tech: "Decarbonizing the Maritime Industry"

One of two 'Free Swims' organized by Peace Boat during this week, this webinar served as an open forum for ocean innovators to connect and exchange strategies with experts in the field, angel investors, scientists and private sector ocean business leaders.

Film Screening: "Against the Tide: A Journey for Climate Hope"

Peace Boat, Global Kids, and Sea Rangers presented a film screening of "Against the Tide: A Journey for Climate Hope," a documentary filmed during Peace Boat's 95th Global Voyage portraying the voyage of seven young leaders from Small Island Developing States as they engage in capacity building and spread their message across the world onboard Peace Boat.

Knowledge into Action – Innovative Solutions to Address Impacts of Ocean Acidification

Peace Boat US joined this discussion on predictive forecasting models, nature-based solutions as mitigation and adaptation tools, and public and private collaborations regarding ocean acidification.

Peace Boat US Director Emilie McGlone presented the EcoShip alongside colleagues and partners including the PangeaSeed Foundation, Coral Vita, Henk Rogers of the Blue Planet Alliance and Fabien Cousteau.

The Peace Boat Ocean and Climate Youth Ambassadors and “Youth for the SDGs” scholars shared their experiences with middle school students from around the world, in collaboration with The Explorers Club and Reach the World youth-focused organization.

July

Fashion x Oceans

Held in partnership with the Global Fashion Exchange, led by Mr Patrick Duffy, Peace Boat US and Ecoshaker, this online program featured 63 speakers who are leaders in fashion, sustainability, and technology, including sustainable fashion expert Alden Wicker, Emilie McGlone from Peace Boat US as well as the representation of 17 different sustainable brands.



UN High Level Political Forum 2020 and Side Event: Youth for the SDGs

Event showcasing Small Island Developing States' youth perspectives on the SDGs, held in collaboration with the Permanent Mission of Trinidad & Tobago to the United Nations, UN SDG Action Campaign, March for Science, and the International Alliance to Combat Ocean Acidification.

August

Global Crowdfunding Campaign #SupportPeaceBoat

Fundraising effort to support Japan-based sister organization Peace Boat, in response to the impact on educational travel programs by the global pandemic. Together, Peace Boat US helped to raise over \$13,000 USD.



International Youth Day

Youth speakers including Ocean and Climate Youth Ambassador, Shafira Charlette from the Seychelles and Youth for the SDGs scholar, Mareeka Dookie from Trinidad and Tobago, shared their experiences with Peace Boat US SDGs-related programs for young people. Co-hosted by organizations March for Science and YOUNGO, the youth constituency of the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change.

Music & Art for Social Change

Peace Boat US featured Chilean music producer and environmentalist Pier Bucci, producer Paul D. Miller a.k.a. DJ Spooky, Michael Tello from PillowTalk, and artist Satoshi Fujita a.k.a. Dragon 76, to share their efforts for social and climate action through art.



September

Virtual Voices Conference on Climate Action

Presented Peace Boat US' work at the event "Working Towards Sustainable Development and Peace Around the World: Inspiring Youth for Ocean Conservation and Climate Action" hosted by the World Information Transfer, as part of its effort to promote fact-based, science-backed news on health and the environment.

Webinar: Climate Resiliency in Big Ocean States

Partnered in a webinar hosted by Oceanic Global, focusing on how sustainable tourism and hospitality sectors in small island states can contribute to strengthening coastal resiliency in the face of climate change. Peace Boat US led one of the discussion rooms with a working group on solutions for ocean pollution through action.

Marketplace of the Future: World's Fair of Sustainability

Operated a Peace Boat US information booth at the virtual "World's Fair of Sustainability" to present innovative ideas for combating climate change and supporting ocean conservation and the SDGs.

Intergenerational Approach to the TPNW



Supporting partner for the event "An Intergenerational Approach to the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons (TPNW) Discussion" bringing together speakers and experts from around the world. October

Voting for the Environment

Partnered with the PangeaSeed Foundation and March for Science on a virtual discussion event focusing on how people can support pro-climate policies through voting. Artists and creatives from around the world were invited to create artworks that inspire voters to cast their ballots with the welfare of the planet and people in mind.



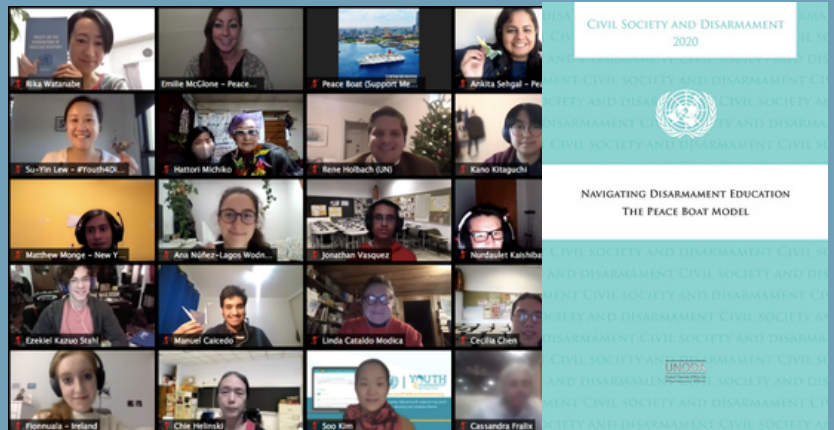
Nukes, Climate Change, and Black Lives Matter: What's the Connection?

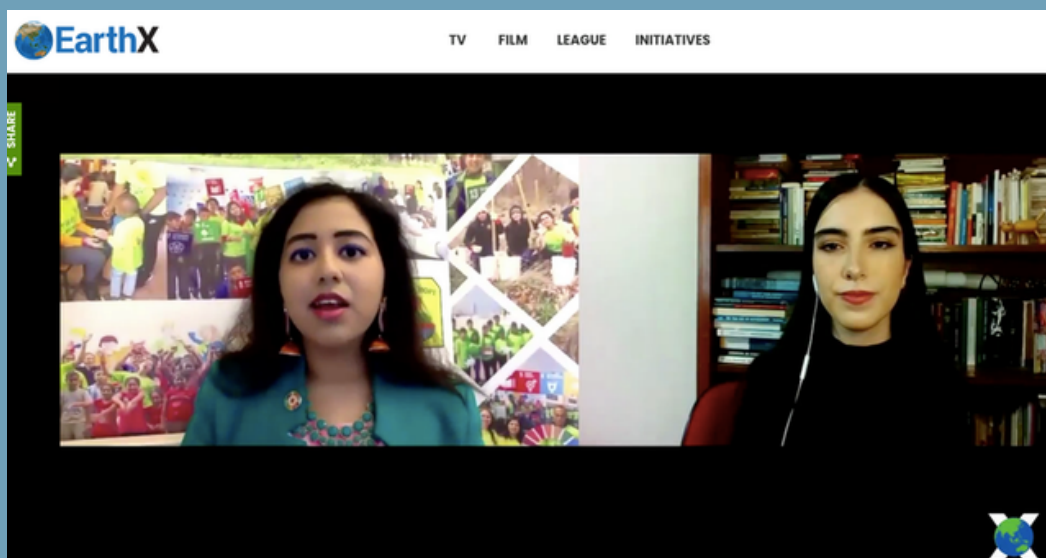
December
