Earth Day 2021: Discover the SDGs and Restore our Earth **June 7**

In honor of the 51st Earth Day, throughout the month of April, Peace Boat US participated in numerous virtual conferences and public events, including "Discover the SDGs - To Make Peace With Nature" and the Earth Day Initiative's kick-off event. At their virtual booths and in event sessions, Peace Boat helped to raise awareness of issues that affect our oceans and the essential role of youth in realizing the SDGs.

Addressing ocean conservation and climate action from a different angle, Peace Boat US also co-curated the exhibition "Fashion x Oceans" and took part in the Global Fashion Exchange "Swapateria" Earth Day event at Selina Chelsea NYC hotel. Combining great designers, ideas from the traditional barter economy, and innovative technology, this event allowed people to swap clothes and accessories while learning about sustainable fashion and the issues of the current fashion industry. For Peace Boat's online community "OCEAN", a special Earth Day-focused event was held, addressing this year's theme 'Restore our Earth' by discussing different ways we can all contribute to this year's key campaigns: tree planting, clean-ups and education.

Climate Action

First Annual Sustainable Energy for All Youth Summit February 11

Peace Boat US youth representatives attended the first annual Sustainable Energy for All Youth Summit that took place from February 9th – February 11th. The event's mission is to educate, connect, and inspire youth from around the globe to develop innovative solutions for SDG 7: Affordable and Clean Energy.

As part of Peace Boat's collaboration with SEforAll, Director of PBUS, Emilie McGlone, interviewed musician and youth leader AY Young about his sustainability project, The Battery Tour. Upon learning that a billion people lack access to electricity, he began powering his concerts with renewable energy, raising awareness about sustainability, and fundraising to bring people electricity.





COP26

November 1-12

From November 1-12, in solidarity with those on the front line of the climate crisis, Peace Boat US participated in this year's COP26 conference. We partnered with other civil society organizations to call for increased ambition on climate action, through events in the UNFCCC administered Blue Zone, in public areas of the city of Glasgow, and virtually with a booth at the COP26 Virtual Ocean Pavilion.



Youth Engagement

The SDG Global Festival of Action March 25

The SDG Global Festival of Action kicked off with an interactive platform for participants to explore and connect with people from all over the world committed to achieving the Sustainable Development Goals. Peace Boat US youth representatives attended the virtual festival, using the innovative set-up that allows participants to easily listen to and engage with leaders, advocates, entrepreneurs and committed citizens working on the SDGs. The platform was divided into different areas that mimicked how a festival would usually be set up, with areas for participants to experience immersive media and connect directly with renowned artists as well as video chat with experts on topics ranging from poverty and inequality to climate action. Overall, the festival found new ways to inspire and mobilize people and organizations to take action.



International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) Global Youth Summit

April 15-16

The overall goal of the One Future Global Youth Summit was to strengthen connections between young leaders and their existing global networks, encourage interdisciplinary learning, provide a space for broader storytelling on conservation, and add momentum to growing youth movements for nature and climate.

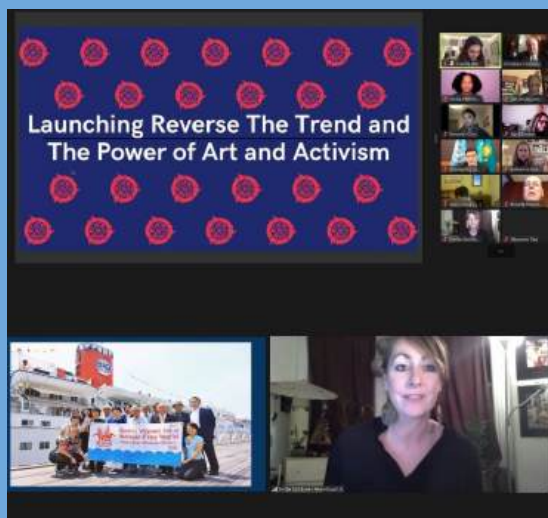
Peace Boat hosted a networking session during the summit to share with young people their work and strides made towards obtaining the Sustainable Development Goals and answer any questions they may have about our volunteer opportunities, “Youth for the SDGs” scholarship or Peace Boat overall programming. Youth from around the world were invited to participate in youth-led capacity building workshops, networking events, and contributed to an outcome document that was delivered to IUCN’s World Conservation Congress in 2021.



Disarmament

Launch of Reverse the Trend and The Power of Art and Activism January 22

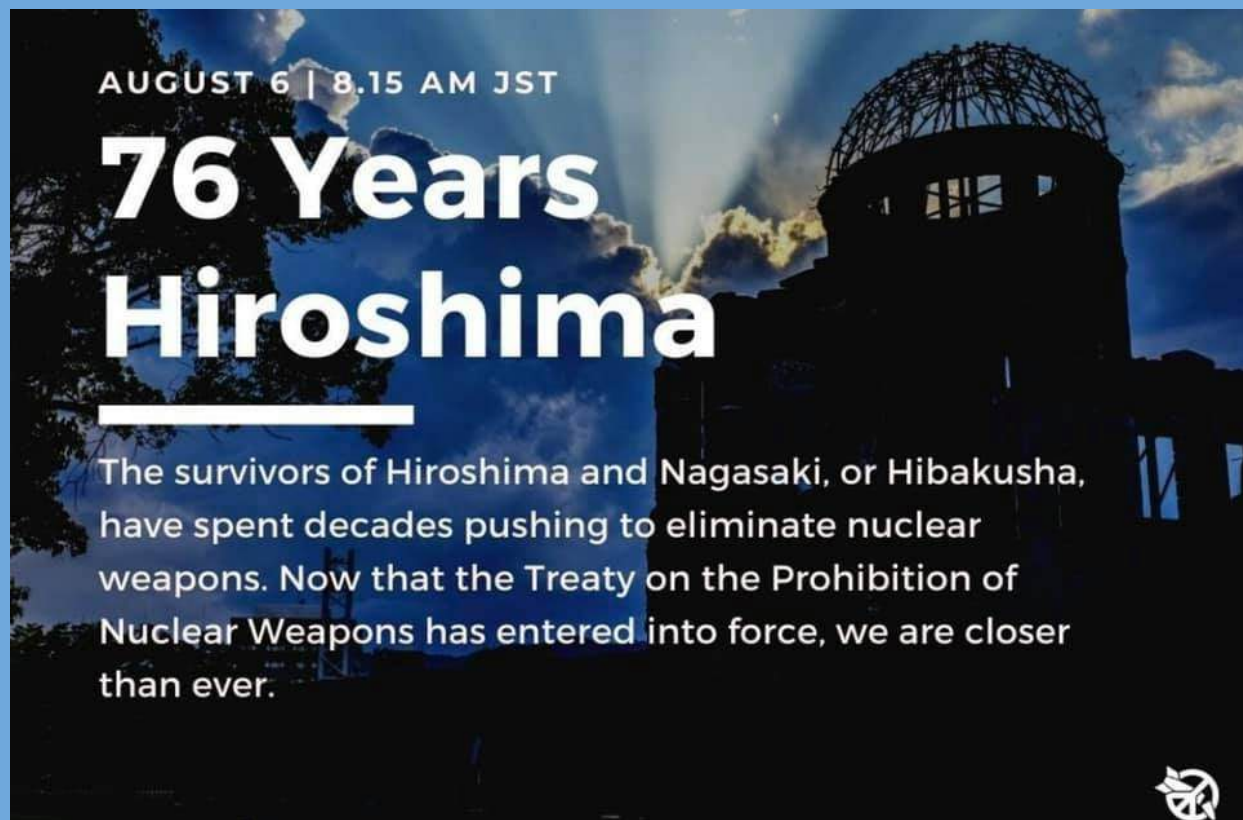
Peace Boat US co-sponsored the launch of “Reverse the Trend: Save Our People, Save Our Planet.” As part of the celebration of the Treaty Prohibiting Nuclear Weapons (TPNW) entry into force on January 22nd. This event brought together artists, activists, and UN delegates who are working together towards a nuclear-free world. The event included remarks from the Ambassador to the Permanent Mission of Kiribati, presentations from various youth and indigenous groups, and an in-depth conversation on the utilization of the arts to express thoughts and feelings on nuclear and environmental injustices. This event also included words from Peace Boat’s guest speaker Ms. Toshiko Tanaka, a Hiroshima artist and a-bomb survivor who has worked with Peace Boat’s Hibakusha project to share her testimony.



Hiroshima Nagasaki Day: Youth event at Selina Hotel

August 6

Peace Boat US co-hosted the New York City Peace Festival at the Selina Chelsea NYC Hotel along with the Nuclear Age Peace Foundation, Reverse The Trend: Save Our People, Save Our Planet. The event commemorated the 76th anniversary of Hiroshima and Nagasaki and featured youth activists, musicians, and diplomats to discuss advocacy opportunities for disarmament and climate activism. Keynote presentations included a message from Diane Barnes of the UN Office for Disarmament Affairs, H.E. Ambassador Amatlain Elizabeth Kabua of the Marshall Islands, H.E. Ambassador Teburoro Tito of Kiribati, as well as testimonies of the survivors from Hiroshima atomic bombings through film. Youth activists also had the opportunity to present, including Peace Boat intern and UN Youth Champion for Disarmament Christelle Barakat; "Youth for the SDGs" scholar Juan Sebastian Olea, Nuclear Age Peace Foundation and Reverse The Trend interns Sajani Patel, Andrew Kim, and Jack Moses.

"Hearing the testimonies of survivors of nuclear weapons use was impactful and gave me insight to the humanitarian consequences of nuclear weapons. 2021 Additional Activities

February 2 - Youth4Disarmament

Peace Boat US partnered with the The United Nations Office for Disarmament Affairs as they introduced their newest members of their youth-focused program, Youth4Disarmament. This program helps share Peace Boat's ongoing initiative "Every Second Counts for the Survivors! - Peace Boat Hibakusha Project Online", which aims to educate people about nuclear disarmament by sharing first-hand accounts of Hibakusha (atomic bomb survivors).

November 3 - Peace Boat Ecoship: Sailing for the SDGS and Climate Action



On November 3rd at the SDG Pavilion of the UN Climate Change Conference in Glasgow, COP26, Peace Boat presented Peace Boat's Ecoship as a flagship for the UN Sustainable Development Goals, alongside our partners from Oceanic Global, March for Science and featuring the voices of our Ocean and Climate Youth Ambassadors.

November 6 - COP26 SDG Pavilion Event

Peace Boat held a side event at UN DESA's SDG Pavilion in the Blue Zone focused on SDG13 (Climate Action) and SDG14 (Life Below Water). The event heard from Nathalia Lawen, from Seychelles who joined Peace Boat's most recent Ocean and Climate Youth Ambassador Program. 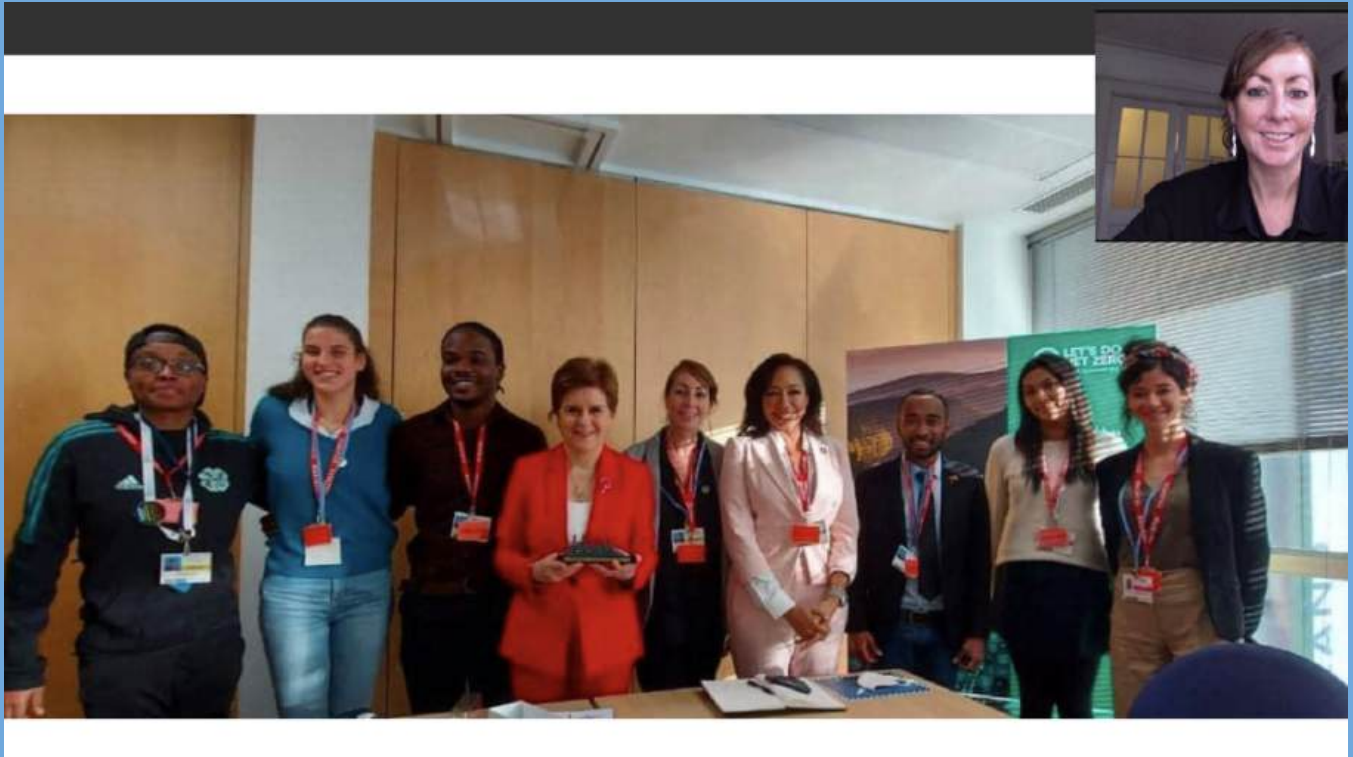
